IUSTI Europe and IUSTI World

IUSTI World ExCo members, Chicago, July 2023

The IUSTI World Executive Committee met twice during the Chicago meeting. European members make significant contributions to the running of IUSTI World: Jackie Sherrard (UK) took over as Secretary General, Usha Hartgill (Norway) was co-opted as Assistant Secretary, Andrew Winter (UK) joins Henry de Vries (Netherlands) and Jørgen Jensen (Denmark) as elected ExCo members, while Jonathan Ross (UK) remains Treasurer. Stephen Lautenschlager (Switzerland) has completed his term of service on ExCo.

Key issues discussed included:

- Liaison with WHO, including input to guidelines, laboratory manuals and the Global Health Summit.
- Regional reports from around the world covering local activities, efforts to reduce stigma, scholarships, educational efforts and professional development.
- The formal scientific World Congress programme including Chicago 2023, Sydney 2024, Montreal 2025, Prague 2026 and selection of New Delhi for the 2027 meeting.

- IUSTI Centenary celebrations noting Jackie Sherrard's huge efforts compiling a
 historical archive and a lively video created in conjunction with the American Sexual
 Health Association summarizing what IUSTI means to people today.
- Incoming President Jo-Anne Dillon's vision to strengthen organisational memory (the 'WISDOM' project), explore a global 'STI day', forge better links with patient and advocacy groups to increase impact, and explore how to raise more money to support scholarships to fund LMIC members attending meetings.

Prof. Henry de Vries was awarded a silver IUSTI medal for his work in delivering the joint ISSTDR/IUSTI congress in the difficult 'lock-down' conditions of 2021 and Dr Janet Wilson was awarded a gold medal for her leadership of IUSTI World through the pandemic.

Professor Dillon also joined the most recent IUSTI Europe Council Zoom call.

IUSTI Europe Advanced Course – October 2023

"SYPHILIS: From Alpha to Omega". The IUSTI Europe Advanced Course marks the fourth of our Advanced Courses linked to an IUSTI Europe Congress, following the successful editions in 2017 in Helsinki, 2019 in Tallinn, and the virtual gathering in 2022 in Tbilisi. Organized by Angelika Stary and Marco Cusini, IUSTI officers for education, this course is scheduled for Thursday, October 26th. Designed to serve as an educational instrument, the advanced courses delve deeply into various aspects of Sexually Transmitted Infections, enlisting renowned field experts as speakers to provide updates that are particularly relevant to clinical practice.

This year's advanced course is dedicated to syphilis, offering a comprehensive overview of the disease. With a noticeable rise in cases over the past years, syphilis stands as an intriguing and intricate ailment. The course aims to equip participants with a holistic understanding of the disease, integrating the latest updated information that proves invaluable in everyday clinical practice. Though tailored for young STI professionals, attendees of the congress as a whole will derive substantial benefits. "Syphilis from Alpha to Omega" is slated for Thursday, October 26th, from 10:00 am to 4:00 pm, with a deliberately limited number of participants to encourage enhanced interactivity and robust discussions. The organizers emphasize that interactive exchanges with speakers and facilitators are defining features of these courses, enriching the learning experience for all involved. The course program encompasses the entire spectrum of syphilis. Kicking off with historical insights shared by Professor Michel Janier, the leading author of IUSTI Europe's Syphilis guidelines, the course then traverses through epidemiology, clinical manifestations, differential and laboratory diagnosis, including rapid tests. Notable topics such as congenital syphilis and syphilis in the context of HIV will be thoroughly explored by Dr. S. Fouéré and Dr. D. Gökengin. Professor Georg Stary will delve into the immunological dimensions of syphilis. The course concludes with discussions on current treatments and the issue of resistance, led by Professor George Sorin Tiplica and Dr. Marti Vall Mayans.

Webinar 17 - The best from Germany

March 29, 2023

This event brought together professionals from the Robert Koch Institut (RKI), Ruhr-University Bochum, Universitätsklinikum Carl Gustav Carus, and Charité - Universitätsmedizin Berlin. Topics covered included Germany's strategy for managing HIV, hepatitis and STIs in general, integrated molecular surveillance, syphilis in HIV primary infection, mpox, and a case study on recalcitrant anogenital pustules.

Dr. Kathleen Klaper and PD Dr. Viviane Bremer from the Robert Koch Institut (RKI) discussed Germany's comprehensive approach to managing HIV, STI and hepatitis. The presentation highlighted the importance of integrating molecular surveillance into the country's healthcare system, and the strategy focuses on improving early detection, treatment, and prevention efforts. PD Dr. Adriane Skaletz-Rorowski from WIR-Walk In Ruhr emphasized the significance of interdisciplinary teamwork for sexual health, and highlighted integrated molecular surveillance as a pivotal component of this approach. By combining data from various sources, it enables a more accurate assessment of the epidemiological landscape, which facilitates targeted interventions and resource allocation.

PD Dr. med. **Petra Spornraft-Ragaller**, from the Klinik und Poliklinik für Dermatologie at Universitätsklinikum Carl Gustav Carus, presented on syphilis maligna in the context of HIV primary infection, emphasizing the need for tailored treatment approaches and heightened

awareness among healthcare providers. **Dr. Anja Potthoff**, also from WIR-Walk In Ruhr, delved into the intriguing topic of Monkeypox disease. Finally, PD Dr. med. **Ricardo N. Werner**, from the Klinik für Dermatologie, Venerologie und Allergologie Division of Evidence-Based Medicine (dEBM) at Charité - Universitätsmedizin Berlin, shared a compelling case study involving recalcitrant anogenital pustules. The presentation highlighted the importance of considering rare, but clinically relevant differential diagnoses in the context of STI and dermatological conditions.

Webinar 18 - Recommendations for the Diagnosis and Treatment of Vaginitis

April 26, 2023

This webinar discussed the International Society for the Study of Vulvo- vaginal Diseases (ISSVD)'s extraordinarily comprehensive set of recommendations and guidance concerning the diagnosis and treatment of vaginitis. We were extremely honoured to have **Prof. Jack Sobel** from Wayne State University, United States, sharing his years of wisdom. He fielded many questions, and the recording is a stand-out recommendation.

Webinar 19 - End of Season | STI Pot-Pourri

May 31, 2023

The "End of Season | STI Pot-Pourri" webinar brought together experts in the field of STIs to discuss a diverse range of topics.

Dr. **Oriol Mitja**, from the Sexually transmitted infections and skin neglected tropical diseases section at Hospital Germans Trias i Pujol in Barcelona, Spain, addressed the critical issue of treating syphilis. Dr. Mitja discussed alternatives to penicillin, shedding light on innovative approaches that are particularly relevant for individuals with penicillin allergies or resistance.

Prof. **Marco Cusini**, affiliated with IRCCS Ospedale Maggiore in Milan, Italy, delved into the complexities of genital herpes. He shared challenging cases and clinical scenarios, offering solutions and strategies for managing this common, yet often perplexing STI.

Dr. **Dorian Rollet** from the Hospitalisation de Médecine Addictologique, Département de Psychiatrie et Médecine Addictologique at Hôpital Fernand Widal, presented insights into the

growing concern of chemsex addiction. This emerging issue has profound implications for public health, and Dr. Rollet discussed possible interventions to address this complex challenge. His presentation shed light on the intersection of addiction and sexual health.

The webinar concluded with a presentation by Dr. **Teodora Wi**, lead for Sexually Transmitted Infections, Department of Global HIV, Hepatitis, and STIs Programmes at the World Health Organization (WHO) in Geneva. Dr. Wi provided an overview of WHO's aims and goals for STI and HIV in 2023. Her presentation highlighted the global perspective on STI management and prevention, underscoring the importance of international collaboration and coordinated efforts in combating these public health challenges.

ECEE Network meeting, 10-11 June 2023

IUSTI-Europe was invited to participate in the Network Group meeting of the "Euroguidelines in Central and Eastern Europe" (ECEE) – an association established in 2016 to harmonize standards of care for people living with HIV in Central and Eastern Europe and neighbouring countries.

IUSTI-Europe was represented by Gökengin, Deniz national representative of Turkey, as liaison person and member of ECEE; Jackie Sherrard as Chief Editor of the European STI Guidelines Project and George-Sorin Tiplica as Chair of IUSTI-Europe Council. Valeska Padovese, national representative for Malta and President of the 36th IUSTI-Europe Congress, present as a new member of ECEE. Justyna Kowalska, ECEE President, was a perfect host during the meeting.

Dr Sherrard presented IUSTI-Europe's approach in formulating and disseminating the IUSTI Europe

Guidelines on STIs, which led to much discussion. The prominent and particular role of dermato-venereologists in the diagnostic and treatment of STIs was underlined by Prof. Tiplica, especially in maintaining an accessible tertiary referral service.

Separate talks were focused on possible common activities and on the ECEE session that will take place during the 36th IUSTI-Europe Congress in Malta.

ECDC: STI Network meeting, June 2023

The STI Network met in person at the ECDC office in Stockholm, Sweden on 28-29 June 2023. The Network consists of representatives from EU/EEA Member States. Also invited were partner organisations (WHO Europe, IUSTI Europe, civil society), Euro-GASP contractors and EU candidate countries. The aim was to offer an opportunity for ECDC and STI Network members to reconnect in person after several years of no face-to-face meetings, and resume discussions from the 2022 virtual STI Network meeting. This was a two-day technical meeting with plenary and panel discussions combined with expert keynote talks, small group discussions and country example presentations on recent STI outbreaks and the associated public health responses. IUSTI Europe delegates included **Chris Kenyon** (Belgium), **George-Sorin Tiplica** (Romania) and **Magnus Unemo** (Sweden).

Presentations and panel discussions covered several areas of STI work:

- Progress towards European Union/European Economic Area (EU/EEA) STI surveillance objectives and plans for developing STI surveillance standards for the Member States
- A new ECDC initiative to collect surveillance data from electronic health records where EU/EEA member states will be invited to participate
- Plans for STI monitoring within the ECDC framework service contract for Sustainable Development Goals (SDG) monitoring. During 2024 the indicators will be drafted together with an Advisory Group, with a pilot data collection to take place in the fall.
 The indicators will cover prevention, testing, treatment and enabling environment
- Evidence, effectiveness, benefits and potential harms of doxycycline for prophylaxis
 of bacterial STIs
- Recent trends of increased gonorrhoea notifications among heterosexual people in the EU/EEA
- Feasibility of STI sentinel surveillance in the EU/EEA
- Euro-GASP update on antimicrobial resistance trends of Neisseria gonorrhoeae

- National preparedness and response to STI outbreaks among men who have sex with men (MSM) in the EU/EEA
- Plans for an ECDC preparedness simulation exercise on a STI topic where STI and preparedness colleagues from Member States will attend.
- STI topics for ECDC scientific advice work for the next 2-3 years
- Strategies to accelerate progress towards ending STI epidemics by 2030.

Overall the meeting was very well received and there was a lot of good energy in the room with many ideas brought forward. After a long pandemic with reduced attention to STI work there are now several streams of work starting up which is exciting, and the long-standing collaboration with IUSTI is key to the success of many of these.

Doxy-PEP – demonstration projects



Mpox – news from Portugal

In Portugal, since July 2023 the number of confirmed cases of mpox has been increasing and, so far, around 100 cases have been reported. Most of reported cases occurred in the Lisbon region, similar to the 2022 outbreak.

Clinical services became aware of suspected cases, including in mpox vaccinated individuals. Laboratory confirmation of MPV infection raised our alertness. Re-infection in individuals who previously had the disease makes this cluster of mpox cases more worrying.



Health services, namely emergency room, STI outpatient clinics, dermatovenereology and infectious disease departments have been reorganised to receive all the suspected cases. PPE requirements and cleaning protocols have been re-implemented. However with the experience gained in the previous outbreak, this reorganization was more agile and easier. Healthcare staff are dealing with those affected with less fear.

Probably because we had experienced a mpox outbreak before, in this outbreak there is less panic. mpox is now perceived by the patients and healthcare workers as a mostly benign condition.

Vaccine programmes have been instigated across Portugal in 2022 mpox outbreak, with an excellent acceptance. And now, mpox vaccination is encouraged again. Vaccines are free and are given to all people considered to be at risk. Community patient groups, NGOs and social media continue to play an important role in establishing campaigns taking a target approach to those most vulnerable to mpox acquisition

Sexual Health, STI and HIV Research Roundup

The burden of hepatitis B and C in Europe

Just published in Lancet Public Health in September 2023 is an update to the Global Burden of Disease study 2019 related to Hepatitis B and C. In 2019, Europe witnessed approximately 2.08 million new cases of acute hepatitis B and 0.49 million cases of hepatitis C spanning all age groups. While some reductions were seen in certain HBV and HCV-related diseases from 2010 to 2019, these conditions continue to exert a significant toll, underscoring the need for more robust and synchronized efforts across European nations to achieve the 2030 elimination target. More details can be found hepatitis B and C. In 2019, Europe witnessed approximately 2.08 million cases of hepatitis C spanning all age groups. While some reductions were seen in certain HBV and HCV-related diseases from 2010 to 2019, these conditions continue to exert a significant toll, underscoring the need for more robust and synchronized efforts across European nations to achieve the 2030 elimination target. More details can be found hepatitis B and C. In 2019, Europe witnessed approximately 2.08 million cases of hepatitis C spanning all age groups. While some reductions were seen in certain HBV and HCV-related diseases from 2010 to 2019, these conditions continue to exert a significant toll, underscoring the need for more robust and synchronized efforts across European nations to achieve the 2030 elimination target.

A diagnostic-escape Finnish new variant of Chlamydia trachomatis remains a threat.

A study that investigated the occurrence of the Finnish new variant of *Chlamydia trachomatis* and other previously described chlamydial variants that escape the detection with the Aptima Combo 2 (AC2) molecular test showed that they are still present in Finland in 2022 - three years after the introduction of the updated AC2 assay. This is a diagnostic consideration which underscores the need for a prudent testing and evaluation approach.

Slovenia's large STI prevalence survey first of its kind in central Europe

To enhance the foundation for STI prevention and control policies in Slovenia, and to supplement the routinely available STI surveillance data, the second Slovenian National Survey of Sexual Lifestyles, Attitudes, and Health had the objective of estimating the prevalence of *C. trachomatis*, *N. gonorrheae*, *M. genitalium* and *T. vaginalis* among individuals aged 18-49. This study marked the first of its kind in a central European country. The significant prevalence of *C. trachomatis* and the frequent occurrence of *Mycoplasma genitalium* in young adults imply gaps in testing, diagnosis, and treatment; consequently, ongoing monitoring becomes imperative to inform and guide the development of prevention and control policies and strategies at the national, regional, and global levels.

HIV epidemiology in Europe

ECDC continues with meticulous HIV/AIDS surveillance in Europe. The most recent 2022 report, published jointly by the European Centre for Disease Prevention and Control (ECDC) and the WHO Regional Office for Europe, can be found here.

A study in Kazakhstan of people newly found to have HIV infection between 2018 and 2020 highlighted a concerning increase in HIV infection rates in Kazakhstan, particularly among men aged 37 and older, underscoring the need for targeted prevention and intervention strategies. The study identified a significant issue with treatment adherence among people living with HIV.

Following the Russian invasion of Ukraine on 24 Feb 2022 more than 7 million people have been displaced across Europe. Massman et al report on the Czech Republic's experience integrating nearly 500 displaced people living with HIV into local services. Most were women with well-controlled HIV. Nearly 20% were co-infected with hepatitis C. Many arrived with little or no medication. The findings underscore the need for enhanced collaboration and coordination among healthcare services both within the Czech Republic and across European Union nations to ensure the optimal care for refugees living with HIV

European Testing Week is an initiative in Europe that calls on partner organizations spanning community groups, healthcare facilities, and policy institutions to come together twice a year for a week-long period. Its primary objectives are to boost testing endeavors and raise awareness about the advantages of early hepatitis and HIV testing. This campaign has evolved significantly since its inception in 2013 and has now become a well-established European event, drawing the participation of numerous organizations each year.

IUSTI Europe Guidelines

All current and draft guidelines are published here: <u>Treatment Guidelines (Europe)</u> The guidelines group is chaired by Dr Jackie Sherrard, UK and meets quarterly.

The <u>vaginal discharge</u> guideline has had some minor revisions.

Under review are guidelines on chlamydia, partner management, scabies and non-specific urethritis.

Over the next year we plan to pilot a new way of producing 'living guidelines' using an online tool which should make guideline production more straightforward.

The guidelines group is always looking for members with skills in guideline development, critical appraisal of literature and writing to contribute, both at the level of the Guidelines Editorial group and to help with individual guidelines as lead or co-author. The next Guidelines group meeting will be during the Malta conference at the end of October.
